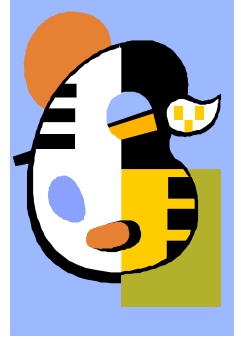

Working in 3-D: Innovative Sculptural Forms

Joe Washington, Associate Professor of Fine Arts at Alabama A&M University, will explore the many facets of working in the third dimension. Learn about a variety of visual sources and techniques. Teachers will learn ways to enhance their visual arts classroom curricula. *Working in 3-D: Innovative Sculptural Forms* workshop will assist teachers in aiding students to develop critical thinking skills and in understanding the creative process. From a slide presentation of sculptural forms, participants will have the opportunity to develop their visual skills through hands-on three-dimensional sculptural techniques using found objects and other materials for embellishment.

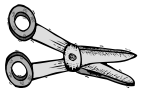

Joe Washington's Biography: B.F.A. from Indiana University and M.F.A. from School of the Art Institute of Chicago. Artist and Associate Professor at Alabama A&M University in the Fine Arts Department. Currently teaches three-dimensional design studio and art appreciation classes. Also teaches metal jewelry making and sculpture. Recently taught an enameling workshop at the Huntsville Museum of Art's Museum Academy. Former Huntsville Museum of Art Exhibition Designer – responsible for design layout for all traveling and in-house exhibitions, supervise construction and installation of exhibitions, design graphic materials including signage, didactics, text, and museum newsletter.
