It was an honor and pleasure to host an exhibition by one of today's finest photographers.

Another addition to the collection is from long-time friends Audrey and

Impressionist Landscapes from the Sellars Collection

Now through July 11, 2021 | Chan Gallery

With the acquisition of the Sellars Collection of Art by American Women in 2008, an important holding of paintings, drawings, and sculptures was added to the Museum's permanent collection. The Collection celebrates the achievements of American women artists active between 1850 and 1940, and provides a counterpoint to the Museum's holdings of regionally and nationally significant contemporary art.


Impressionist Landscapes from the Sellars Collection focuses on the strong pull that the natural world had on women artists during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The exhibition emphasizes the generation of artists who emerged during and in the aftermath of the American Impressionist movement (1880-1920).

Many of these artists were the students and sketching partners of the seminal figures in the development of Impressionism in America, such as William Merritt Chase, Willard L. Metcalf, John Henry Twachtman, and Robert Henri. The artists included in the exhibition were primarily

concerned with capturing the effects of light, color, and atmosphere in their landscapes, achieved in large measure by painting directly from nature – out-of-doors – rather than in the studio. Though not as well-known as their Impressionist predecessors, this generation of landscape painters flourished in areas such as Old Lyme, Connecticut; Cape Ann, Massachusetts; New Hope, Pennsylvania; and Woodstock, New York, as well as elsewhere in New England and across the Southwest.

Impressionist Landscapes from the Sellars Collection presents over 30 exquisite landscapes in all seasons, varying in scenic subject matter from snow-filled views to sun-drenched hillsides, as well as harbor scenes, woodland glades, and desert vistas. Featured artists include Irene Von Horvath, Edna Lawrence, Margaret Jordan Patterson, Alice Pelton, Lilla Cabot Perry, and many more.

Jack Mitchell: Artists

"We have all heard of someone described as a born writer, ballplayer, or musician, but I would wager that few of us have heard of someone described as a born photographer. Perhaps, this is because one simply needs too many things to make a photograph. However, even though I know that no one is ever a born writer, much less a born photographer, I am tempted to make an exception in the case of Jack Mitchell."

A merican photographer Jack Mitchell (1925-2013) was renowned for his captivating photographs of visual artists, musicians, writers, dancers, and stage and screen personalities, which he documented during a remarkable career that spanned over five decades.

Mitchell's emphasis on creating high contrast images that capture the choreographed moment distinguishes his work from that of other well-known photographers of his generation.

He was also an expert in lighting, and he worked mostly, though not entirely, in black and white. In addition to 25 years of special assignment work for The New York Times, Mitchell's photographs of creative and performing artists have graced the covers and pages of Harper's Bazaar, Life, Newsweek, People, Rolling Stone, Time, Vanity Fair, and Vogue, among others.

During his long career Mitchell became renowned – by his subjects, by the magazine and newspaper editors he worked for, and by critics – as someone who could make a photograph reveal character. For example, his iconic portrait of John Lennon and Yoko Ono, which Mitchell took just a few weeks before Lennon was murdered, presents a side of the couple that was seldom seen in public, relaxed and unguarded.

The same is true of Mitchell's photograph of Andy Warhol with his dog Archie. Tightly cropped, the image captures Warhol holding his beloved dachshund close to his face in a revealing moment of intimacy.

In addition to the images of Lennon, Ono, and Warhol, Jack Mitchell: Artists presents over 50 vintage black-and-white photographs of important visual artists, dancers, musicians and writers captured by Mitchell between 1963 and 1995. Hand-selected by the Huntsville Museum of Art from the Jack Mitchell Archives, Artists features engaging images of singer-songwriter Carly Simon, playwright Tennessee Williams, choreographer Mark Morris, composer Philip Glass, and a wide range of influential painters and sculptors including Alex Katz, Jasper Johns, Ellsworth Kelly, Helen Frankenthaler, Philip Pearlstein, Louise Nevelson, Julian Schnabel, and Louise Bourgeois, among others.

The Jack Mitchell Archives graciously lent additional materials to the exhibition, including photographic and print ephemera that provides a wider view into Mitchell's amazing life and career.

Encounters: Greely Myatt

June 6-August 29, 2021 | Grisham Gallery

Since 1986, the Huntsville Museum of Art has presented a noteworthy series of solo exhibitions highlighting recent work by acclaimed regional contemporary artists. These *Encounters* exhibitions showcase artists at mid-career who are working in various styles and media. They afford viewers an opportunity to see how creative inspiration combines with subject and materials to convey a unique artistic expression.

Throughout the years, the *Encounters* series has developed a strong critical reputation in the Southeast. The spaces used for the exhibitions are large enough to accommodate a solid body of work yet small enough to retain a sense of intimacy and focus. A well-designed and illustrated catalogue, featuring an extended interview with the artist, accompanies each exhibition. To date, the Museum has presented over 75 individual exhibitions in this long-standing series. The latest exhibition focuses on the accomplished works of Greely Myatt, a talented sculptor from Arkansas.

Myatt is widely recognized for his whimsical sculptural objects and monumental installations made from found materials. Over his career, the artist has developed a compelling visual language of reimagined yet recognizable forms which engage many different styles – from Surrealism, to Pop, to Folk and Outsider Art. Through his works, Myatt seeks to spark a dialogue with the viewer around ideas of genre and style, form and content, scale and site, identity and place, and art and craft. He explores these sometimes competing notions through continuous reinterpretations of tangible objects like rag rugs and Southern quilts, as well as more conceptual motifs like comic strip speech bubbles.

The materials Myatt uses to create his works – found broom handles, discarded signage, neon lights, metal scraps and the like – lends them an accessibility and a personal connection for the viewer. Forms like cabinets and rag rugs reference his rural Southern childhood, while abstract elements such as light, air, and negative space often function as integral parts of a piece. Myatt also likes to combine high art references with vernacular influences in the same piece, paying homage to fine artists like Constantin Brancusi and Philip Guston as well as popular cartoonists like Saul Steinberg and R. Crumb.

Born and raised in Mississippi, Myatt currently lives and works in West Memphis, Arkansas. He received a BFA from Delta State University and an MFA from The University of Mississippi, and was a long-time Professor of Art at the

University of Memphis. His sculptures and installations have been exhibited in numerous solo and group exhibitions across the United States, Europe and Japan. He has received grants and fellowships from the Tennessee Arts Commission, the University of Memphis, the University of Georgia, and received the Mississippi Arts and Letters Visual Arts Award in 1994. In 2009, a twenty-year retrospective of Myatt's work was exhibited across Memphis in nine museum and gallery venues.

WE THE PEOPLE:

Portraits of Veterans in America by Mary Whyte

June 27-September 26, 2021 | Huth, Boeing, Salmon and Haws Galleries

TE THE PEOPLE. These words embody the ethos of what it means to be an American citizen. As individuals we are a tapestry of colors and creeds; united we are a nation committed to preserving our hardearned freedom. In this stunning collection of portraits of military veterans, one from each of the fifty states, artist Mary Whyte captures this ethos as well as the dedication, responsibility, and courage it takes to fulfill that promise.

In 2010, Whyte set out on a mission to paint fifty large-scale watercolor portraits of what it means to be an American veteran today. Over seven years in the making, the project took the artist across the United States to meet and paint some of our country's truest patriots. Her portrait of America includes individuals from many walks of life, some still on active duty, and from every branch – women and men, old and young, and from a wide swath of ethnicities, befitting our glorious melting pot. From a mayor to an astronaut, from a teacher to a garbage collector, from a business entrepreneur to someone who is homeless, Whyte renders their unique and exceptional lives with great care and gentle brush strokes.

An artist, author and teacher, Whyte's watercolor paintings have earned international recognition. Her works

are included in numerous public collections including the Gibbes Museum of Art in Charleston, South Carolina; the Greenville County Museum of Art in Greenville, South Carolina; and the Mazza Museum of International Art in Findlay, Ohio, as well as in many government, university and corporate collections across the United States. In 2013, Whyte was one of ten artists worldwide invited to travel to China and exhibit her watercolors at the Nanning Art Museum. Her work has also been featured in many international publications, including periodicals and books in China, Russia, France, Germany, the UK, Canada and Taiwan.

The recipient of numerous honors, Whyte was awarded the Portrait Society of America's Gold Medal. She is also the recipient of the Philadelphia Watercolor Society's Lifetime Achievement Award, and the Elizabeth O'Neil Verner Award, South Carolina's highest honor in the arts.





Recent Donations to the Museum's Permanent Collection

The Huntsville Museum of Art is pleased to announce new additions to its permanent collection. Celeste Birdcage was donated by Jennifer and Rocco Marcello and Mark Marcello of Palm Beach, FL. The piece makes an interesting and unusual addition to the Museum's craft collection, functioning much like the works in the Buccellati collection, which are also exquisite examples of Italian craftsmanship produced for a luxury market.

The Museum was also given two nineteenth century portraits by Emily and Jack Burwell: Phillip Romer's *Portrait* of Georgia Gibb and William Frye's *Portrait* of a Young Girl. Both artists were born in Germany but immigrated to the United States in the mid 1800s.

The Museum also received the Gloria Vanderbilt painting *Sunlight* from Audrey and Martin Gruss. This piece was featured in the 2020-2021 exhibit *Gloria Vanderbilt*: An *Artful Life*. The painting is a good representation of the style of Vanderbilt's later work with her painterly approach and Surrealist feel and can complement representational as well as abstract works in the collection.

In addition, the Huntsville Museum of Art is honored to accept seven of Jonathan Becker's stunning photographs of Gloria Vanderbilt into the collection as well as Jack Mitchell's Composer and Diarist Ned Rorem with Designer Gloria Vanderbilt. These eight prints were included in the exhibit Gloria Vanderbilt: An Artful Life in 2020-2021.

His foundational childhood experiences in planting naturally led to an appreciation for horticulture, genetic diversity, plant pairing and an orderly, holistic approach to work. Mike Rogers is a former member of Congress representing Michigan's Eighth Congressional District. He previously served as an officer in the U.S. Army and as an FBI special agent in Chicago. While in Congress, Mr. Rogers chaired the powerful House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence (HPSCI) where he led the bipartisan Huawei investigation and report issued in 2012 and authorized and oversaw a budget of \$70 billion which funded the nation's 17 intelligence agencies.

Today, Mr. Rogers advises C-suite executives from Fortune 100 companies, providing analysis and expertise on the challenges facing companies operating in the digital era, as well as cybersecurity and executive leadership. He currently serves as the Vice Chairman of the Board at the MITRE Corporation, and as a Director at leading companies including CyberSponse, IAP, and 4IQ. Additionally, Mr. Rogers is a Senior Fellow at Harvard University and a member of the Board of Trustees and the David Abshire Chair at the Center for the Study of the Presidency and Congress, where he directs the Center's national security programs.

Mr. Rogers is a regular public speaker on global affairs, cybersecurity, and leadership. He also serves as a regular national security commentator on CNN and hosts the channel's documentary-style original series Declassified, offering viewers insights into America's spy stories. Mr. Rogers is a 1985 graduate of Adrian College. He is married to Kristi Rogers and has two children.
