

Capturing Radiant Light in Your Paintings in Oil or Acrylic with Michael Story

Skill Level: Beginner to Advanced
Thursday, April 11 – Sunday, April 14, 2024; 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. \$650 members/\$700 non-members

Master your ability to capture radiance in your paintings and join South Carolina artist Michael Story for this four-day landscape painting workshop. Michael will explain and demonstrate the fundamentals of building radiant color by applying complementary and analogous color combinations. Color charts and simple exercises will be made easy and can be kept for future color reference after the class is completed. We will use effective underpainting and layering of color in trees, grasses, sky and water to create interest and authenticity in our subject matter. The workshop begins with an I-Pad step-by-step presentation showing a progression of Michael's painting techniques from start to finish. Students begin their paintings with an initial charcoal drawing, followed by a color wash applied over the image. Starting with rich shadow colors, you'll begin blocking in your painting, then progressing dark to light to completion. Building final layers of color and avoiding muddy mixtures, you'll achieve fresh, bright, radiant color while capturing depth and drama to your work.

Michael Story earned a BFA in Fine Art from the University of South Carolina in 1976. He later traveled to New York, studying pastel and oil painting under internationally known artist Daniel Greene. Today, he is an award-winning artist who regularly teaches pastel and oil painting. His paintings have been reproduced by major publishers and distributed worldwide. Flora & Fauna in Watercolor with Pat Banks

Discover the wonder and magic of watercolor! This workshop will focus on and be inspired by plants and animals from our region. There will be an introduction to the artist and a brief showcase of some of her work, including the watercolor paintings created for the children's book *Plants and Animals of Appalachia*, forthcoming from the University Press of Kentucky. Then Pat will lead the explorations with fun and informative hands-on participatory demonstrations and individual instruction. Students will use the new "tools" in their toolboxes to create two sketches using the plants and animals of their choice, then choose the best composition to turn into an 11x22" watercolor painting. The techniques and experiences explored throughout the workshop will inform these paintings and compositions. Pat will demonstrate and provide individual instruction and problem solving throughout!

Pat Banks is a signature member of the Kentucky Watercolor Society, Kentucky Guild of Artists, and Craftsmen, founding member of the Gallery on Main in Richmond, Kentucky, and has illustrated four children's books. Her work is in the collection of Bristal Myers Squib, St Joseph Hospital, Baptist Health, Louisville Zoo, Appalachian Center at the University of Kentucky, Eastern Kentucky University and Union College and many other corporate and private collections. She has been a visiting artist in Ecuador, Japan, and France, and is a teaching artist with the Kentucky Arts Council, the Berea Learn Shops and other workshop venues. Still Life Painting in Acrylic or Oil with Donna Bland

Skill Level: Beginner to Advanced Thursday, September 12 – Sunday, September 15, 2024; 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. \$600 members/\$650 non-members

Donna Bland will explain her process of creating vibrant paintings through daily demonstrations and individual assistance. She will demonstrate values and color mixing and composition. In a three-step process of painting, Donna will first create the still life composition on the canvas; next, she will create values of shadow and light patterns; and lastly, she adds the color, modeling fine details and highlights.

Bland lives and paints in the Austin, Texas area. Painting daily in her studio, *plein air* or teaching a workshop, subjects are unlimited. She loves to learn, create and share what she has experienced in finishing a painting. She is a member of Oil Painters of America, the American Impressionist Society, the Austin Plein Air Painters, American Women Artists, and Artists of Texas. She has received numerous awards and has paintings in corporate and private collections. When she first started painting, Bland was taught to paint scenes that interested her — this adds a feeling of excitement to her painterly strokes. Each canvas is the opportunity to create a new design made of various colors and shapes. She formally studied art at The Student Art League of New York, Scottsdale School of Art, University of Georgia, and Tyler Junior College in Texas. Bland has been fortunate to paint with modern day masters throughout the United States as well as Europe, and continues to study and read works by John Singer Sargent, Nicolai Fechin, Richard Schmid, Joaquin Sorolla and Emile Gruppé. Master Artist Workshops

Watercolor Painting with Tony Couch

Skill Level: Beginners, Students, Hobbyists & Professional Artists Monday, October 7 – Wednesday, October 9, 2024; 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; and Thursday, October 10, 2024; 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. \$600 members/\$650 non-members

The workshop sessions begin as Couch completes a painting, explaining what he is doing, and why, as he paints. Students paint in the afternoons, after which Couch critiques all the day's completed work, including his own. Anyone 18 or older is eligible to enroll. An optional slide show/lecture on the principles of design — including color and composition — will be presented in the afternoon of the first day.

Couch received a bachelor's degree in art from the University of Tampa and did further work at Pratt Institute in New York. Simultaneously, he worked as an artist for Associated Press and freelance illustrator while studying watercolor painting with Edgar A. Whitney, ANA. His first book, Watercolor: You Can Do It, became North Light Publishing's all-time best-selling book on painting. It has been the textbook for several college art departments and has been translated into Chinese for markets overseas. A follow-up book on technique went through three printings and was translated into Japanese for that market. A third, Tony Couch's Keys to Successful Painting was also published by North Light. His watercolor instruction articles have appeared in Palette Talk, The American Artist, Australian Artist, North Light Watercolor Magic and "the artist" magazines. His work is included in twelve art instruction articles and publications by other artists in the US, Australia and the UK. He has produced 10 "How To" videos and DVDs, some of which are used in colleges and in various state educational systems via television. He conducts workshops throughout the US and abroad. Watercolor Floral with Alan Shuptrine

At the end of this two-day workshop, participants will have a finished composition of their own.

A painter known for his watercolor technical ability, sensitive and thought-provoking paintings, Shuptrine has extended his reputation from a renowned master craftsman and water gilder to a nationally acclaimed watercolorist. He has continued the legacy of realism that both Andrew Wyeth and his own father, Hubert Shuptrine, established, with highly detailed and dramatic lighting in his landscapes and figurative paintings. Alan's medium is primarily watercolor which he applies and controls in various techniques, from wet-in-wet to drybrush. He prefers to handcraft, carve, and gold leaf his own frames for his paintings. His paintings are collected nationally, in both corporate and private collections. A resident of Lookout Mountain, Tennessee, Shuptrine's pursuit of the arts includes schooling at The Baylor School, The University of the South and The University of Tennessee. You can also print out a registration form from the Museum's website and mail it along with your payment.

Cancellation Policies

Half-Day Camps: All fees must be paid in full before a student is fully registered. Camps are filled on a first-come, first-served basis! Any cancellation or change made more than ten days before your child's first day of half-day camp carries a processing fee of \$20; if you cancel your registration before the ten-day deadline, you will receive a refund less the \$20 processing fee. No refunds can be given for cancellations made less than ten days prior to the start of the selected half-day camp.

The Huntsville Museum of Art reserves the right to cancel any half-day camp that does not meet minimum enrollment or for other unforeseen circumstances. We will do our best to notify families at least ten days prior to the start of a half-day camp session if a particular camp is cancelled. Any payments made toward a week of half-day camp that the Huntsville Museum of Art cancels will be eligible for a refund or can be applied to another half-day camp if space permits.

Classes: All fees must be paid in full before a student is fully registered. Classes are filled on a first-come, first-served basis! A \$20 fee will be charged for canceling registration; the balance will be refunded. However, there will be no refund for cancellations within one week of the first class. (Please Note: Master Artist Workshops' cancellation policy may vary depending on each workshop. Visit hsvmuseum.org/academy/master-artistworkshops/ for more details.). The Huntsville Museum of Art reserves the right to cancel classes which do not meet minimum enrollment requirements. We will notify you at least three days in advance to start of the class if a particular class is cancelled. In the case of cancellation by the Huntsville Museum of Art, any payment towards a class will be eligible for a refund or can be applied to another class if space permits. The Huntsville Museum of Art assumes no liability for non-refundable airline tickets or other expenses that cannot be used due to any classes or workshops being cancelled or schedule changes.
