This year marks the **37**th annual **Youth Art Month (YAM)** exhibition of K-12 student artwork at the Huntsville Museum of Art. The **YAM** and **Congressional Art Competition** winning entry (**CAC**) exhibitions will be on view **February 25 – March 31, 2024** while **Visual Arts Achievement Program (VAA)** exhibition will be on view **February 25, 2024**. The YAM opening and the VAA and Congressional Art Competition awards presentation will take place on **Sunday, February 25, 2024**.

This exhibition not only showcases the exuberance and vitality of children's art, but also underscores the importance of art as an essential subject in students' curriculum. Great art teachers are dedicated to educating students about art history, art criticism, aesthetics, and studio production and ensuring that students are exposed to a variety of art techniques, artists, and materials. A qualified, certified art teacher is an essential component in providing that all students receive the best art education possible.

The National Art Education Association (NAEA), Alabama Art Education Association (AAEA), Alabama State Department of Education, Alabama Arts Alliance (AAA), and the Huntsville-Madison County Art Education Association (HMCAEA) all endorse **Youth Art Month** in recognition of quality student artwork inspired by certified art teachers in the classroom.

Attached you will find both the YAM and VAA guidelines. Each middle (**Grades 6-9**) and high school (**Grades 9-12**) art teacher is allowed <u>to submit up to 10 pieces of artwork for</u> <u>VAA jurying</u>, <u>one</u> of which will become your YAM entry from District V Visual Arts Achievement Program (VAA) (**Grades 6-12**) and **Congressional Art Competition** (CAC) (**Grades 9-12**) (5th Congressional District). The CAC artwork will be juried after the VAA selection process.

Affix a completed entry form to each piece of artwork submitted. <u>In the upper right-hand</u> <u>corner of the entry form</u>, we are asking you to rank your ten pieces (1-10) with number <u>1</u> being the best. All ten pieces will then be judged for VAA. At the completion of the judging, the highest number remaining will be your YAM entry.

Disclaimer/Liability: As the art teacher, I hereby certify that this is the student's original work, and that it is not copied from another artist, internet image, magazine or book illustration, or other artwork that was not originally his/hers. As the art teacher, I further give my permission for publication of my student's work for publicity and archival purposes only, both in print and on-line. The Huntsville Museum of Art is not responsible for loss, damage or breakage.

Remember, when you rank the pieces, you are ranking them for YAM. If entering a piece for VAA that is quite large and exceeds YAM guidelines, you would want to rank that piece with a low number such as 10.

Huntsville Museum of Art <u>vaa: visual arts achievement program/</u> <u>congressional art competition 2024 guidelines</u>

The Visual Arts Achievement Program provides an opportunity for talented middle and high school students in Alabama to receive recognition for their achievements in visual arts. The program is conducted locally, and pieces of artwork are selected as Blue Ribbon Finalists. An exhibition will be held at the Huntsville Museum of Art. The artwork of the Blue Ribbon Finalists will be sent to the Alabama State Council on the Arts in Montgomery and included for judging in a statewide exhibition.

Listed below are deadlines and information for art teachers in District V for the following Alabama counties: Blount, Calhoun, Cherokee, Cleburne, Colbert, Cullman, DeKalb, Etowah, Franklin, Jackson, Lauderdale, Lawrence, Limestone, Madison, Marion, Marshall, Morgan, St. Clair, and Winston Counties.

Categories include painting, drawing, mixed media, three-dimensional, printmaking, photography (at least 30 square inches), and computer images (graphics). Work will be selected based on quality, creativity, and presentation. Entries not meeting these standards will not be accepted. Authenticity Verification & Disclaimer: I (defined as student and art teacher) hereby certify that this is my original work, and that it is not copied from another artist, internet image, magazine or book illustration or other artwork that was not originally mine. As the art teacher, I further give my permission for publication of my student's work for publicity and archival purposes only, both in print and on-line. The Huntsville Museum of Art is not responsible for loss, damage or breakage.

Artwork does **NOT** need to be matted. The Huntsville Museum of Art will mat the work of the Blue Ribbon Finalists.

- 2. No Xerox-copied or traced works will be accepted.
- 3. District V high school student entries that are located within 5th Congressional District counties: (Madison, Morgan, Limestone, Colbert, Lauderdale, Lawrence, and Jackson) will automatically be judged in the Congressional Art Competition. The winning entry will be sent to Washington, D.C. to be displayed for one year. The CAC artwork must be two-dimensional, maximum size of 26" x 26" and 4" deep including the outside of the frame. (Artwork does not need to be framed to be considered for the exhibition. <u>The Museum will have the 1st place winner artwork framed for the exhibition. The winning entry will be on display at the Museum.</u> Artwork categories are as follows: painting, drawing, collage, prints, mixed media, computer generated art, and photography.
- 4. The statewide exhibition will be held with Alabama State Council on the Arts, located in Montgomery, April 1-26, 2024. An award ceremony will be held on April 11, 2024.

Huntsville Museum of Art YAM 2024 Guidelines FOR PUBLIC MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOLS (DECATUR CITY, ATHENS CITY, LIMESTONE COUNTY, AND SCOTTSBORO CITY)

Remember that this year each art teacher will be selecting the artwork that will be hung in the **YAM 2024** exhibition. **There will be no further selection process**. Middle school art teachers will select **<u>1 work</u>** of art from their school. <u>Each</u> high school art teacher will select <u>**1 work**</u> of art from their classes they teach at their school. (For example, if a high school has <u>4</u> art teachers, each art teacher may select and submit <u>1</u> work of art.) See YAM/VAA guidelines for procedure in completing entry form. Please attach inventory sheet to the outside of the portfolio or box. <u>AUTHENTICITY VERIFICATION &</u> <u>DISCLAIMER MUST BE COMPLETED</u> on the entry form for each piece of artwork being submitted for consideration. (Middle and High School entries only.)

- 1. <u>Entries may be two-dimensional (Maximum 20"x 24")</u> or three-dimensional to fit on a pedestal or to be hung on the wall. Artwork does not need to be matted. Works submitted for YAM 2024 will be framed for the exhibit. The frames are the property of the Museum and are not for sale.
- 2. Work should be selected based on quality, creativity, and presentation. Entries not meeting these standards will not be accepted.
- 3. No Xerox, ditto, <u>copied</u>, or traced works will be accepted for exhibition in YAM 2024. (*Defined as a work of art that is copied from a published photograph, magazine, book illustration, web site, other artwork, or by another person.*) As the art teacher, I further give my permission for publication of my student's work for publicity and archival purposes only, both in print and on-line. The Huntsville Museum of Art is not responsible for loss, damage or breakage.
- 4. <u>No group works</u> will be accepted due to space limitations.
- 4. Artwork will not contain organic materials (i.e. food products).
- 5. All entries must have a completed YAM entry form securely attached to the back of the artwork. Please be sure the information is accurate and complete. Many students never receive notice that they are in the show because the entry form has incorrect information on it.

YAM selections for ALL Middle and High Schools (public, city, county, and private schools [DOES NOT include Homeschool organizations]) will be accepted here at the Museum Academy Studio I located on the pondside at Big Spring Park on Monday, January 29, 2024 from 8:30 a.m.-5:00 p.m. Look for directional signs. No entries will be accepted after these times.

(You may also submit your entries early by dropping them off at our Admissions Desk in the Museum Lobby.)
