Compelling Paintings Inspired by the Everyday Photo with Carole Forêt

Skill Level: Beginer to Intermediate Friday, February 6 & Saturday, February 7, 2026; 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. \$600 members/\$650 non-members

Discover how to transform your simple photos into vibrant, expressive paintings with Carole Forêt — an accomplished, widely respected artist with over 35 years of professional experience. Whether you're a beginner eager to learn the fundamentals or an intermediate artist ready to deepen your skills, this immersive two-day workshop will elevate your art practice. Bring 2-3 favorite photos (landscape/cityscape, printed or on a charged device). Photo references will be provided, if needed. Through live demos, individual guidance, and a thoughtfully paced structure, Carole will teach you how to see like an artist—focusing on composition, value, color, and perspective. You'll also learn her signature process: building dynamic acrylic duo-tonal underpaintings that set the stage for luminous, colorful oil finishes. You'll leave the workshop with compelling, layered paintings full of energy and atmosphere.

Carole comes from a strong lineage of family artists and has spent decades creating and teaching across the Southeast and Europe. She has owned galleries in Florida and Alabama, was featured in *Southern Living* (2008), and was the keynote speaker and demonstrator at the Congressional Art Competition in Washington, D.C. (2013). She has led art retreats in Italy and completed a month-long artist residency in France's Champagne region (2019). California Vibe Watercolor Portraiture™ with David Lobenberg

Skill Level: Beginner to Advanced Thursday, March 19 – Sunday, March 22, 2026; 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. \$575 members/\$625 non-members

David Lobenberg will use a reference photo and tracing technique that's super simple to execute. The creativity and painting fun begins during the painting process! Through step-by-step demonstrations, and question-and-answer sessions, Lobenberg will lead artists down a path of expressive, energetic and evocative portrait painting. Students will learn: how to shoot dramatic, stylistic reference photos with a smartphone and natural daylight; how to utilize a simple photo/tracing technique to prepare for the painting process; how to bust through the color barrier; how to mix gutsy colors with a minimal five-color palette; and how to merge positive and negative stencil embellishment techniques into their portraits. At the conclusion of the workshop, artists will have the where-with-all to follow their own path towards creating California Vibe Watercolor Portraits[™]!

Lobenberg has over forty years of experience conducting both studio and *plein air* water media workshops across the United States and Canada, as well as via Zoom and his online California Vibe School of Watercolor™. He has established a reputation for a well-organized, energetic, fun, and high-spirited teaching style. He received his M.A. degree from UCLA and taught for seventeen years as an adjunct art professor at Sacramento City College. His work has been exhibited and published in the United States, Europe and Asia, and has appeared in the *Plein Air Magazine*, *International Artist* and *Pratique Des Arts*, *Hors-Serie Aquarelle* publications. Wet Concrete Carving with Elder Jones

Skill Level: All levels of experience are welcome, beginner to advanced. Friday, June 5, 2026; 1:00 to 4:00 p.m., Saturday, June 6, 2026; 9:00 a.m.to 6:00 p.m. & Sunday, June 7, 2026; 9:00 a.m.-12 p.m. \$500 members/\$550 non-members

Learn to build forms, prepare sand mix concrete, sculpt and hand carve in the soft matrix in this wet-carved concrete workshop. No power tools or hammer and chisel are required. Students will be given a working understanding of Portland cement and the variety of possibilities the technique offers. Choose to make either a planter or a sculpture of about 35 lbs. Carving tools and materials provided. By the end of the carving day everyone will have completed their piece short of it having sit overnight to cure before handling.

Elder Garrison Jones is a native "baby boomer" of Chattanooga, Tennessee. He received his undergraduate, biology and art, and graduate, biology, degrees at Middle Tennessee State University. He was the only apprentice of the late Jack B. Hastings where he was exposed to wet-carving sand mix concrete and has developed his own style over the past forty years. Still Life Oil Painting with Qiang Huang

Skill Level: Beginner to Advanced Thursday, June 11 – Saturday, June 13, 2026; 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. \$525 members/\$550 non-members

Qiang's approaches to still-life painting will be demonstrated with particular focus on creating dramatic setups by observing the light distribution and using bold and loose strokes to create a powerful and accurate representation on canvas. Using demonstrations, presentation, and individual assistance, Qiang will explain his process of creating energetic paintings by manipulating values, colors, edges, and brushwork. Personal attention will be given to each student according to his or her currently skill level and personal goals in art. The workshop is designed for indoor practice with live settings.

Qiang has developed computer tools to help artists to see color more accurately and simplify the painting process. He will share his color study and introduce the tools in this workshop.

Qiang Huang (pronounced as Chong Wong) was born and raised in Beijing, China, and now lives in Austin, Texas. He has studied art from multiple master artists like David Leffel and Sherrie McGraw. His paintings show remarkable accuracy and expressive brush strokes. Since 2004 his paintings have been selected continuously for the 14th, 15th, 16th and 18th Oil Painters of America's National Juried Exhibitions. *American Artist Magazine* has featured his teaching on the summer issue of *Workshop*. Watercolor Painting with Tony Couch

Skill Level: Beginners, Students, Hobbyists & Professional Artists Monday, September 14 – Wednesday, September 16, 2026; 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.; and Thursday, September 17, 2026; 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. \$575 members/\$625 non-members

The workshop sessions begin as Couch completes a painting, explaining what he is doing, and why, as he paints. Students paint in the afternoons, after which Couch critiques all the day's completed work, including his own. An optional slide show/lecture on the principles of design — including color and composition — will be presented in the afternoon of the first day.

Couch received a bachelor's degree in art from the University of Tampa and did further work at Pratt Institute in New York. Simultaneously, he worked as an artist for Associated Press and freelance illustrator while studying watercolor painting with Edgar A. Whitney, ANA. His first book, Watercolor: You Can Do It, became North Light Publishing's all-time best-selling book on painting. It has been the textbook for several college art departments and has been translated into Chinese for markets overseas. A follow-up book on technique went through three printings and was translated into Japanese for that market. A third, Tony Couch's Keys to Successful Painting was also published by North Light. His watercolor instruction articles have appeared in *Palette Talk*, The American Artist, Australian Artist, North Light Watercolor Magic and "the artist" magazines. His work is included in twelve art instruction articles and publications by other artists in the US, Australia and the UK. He has produced 10 "How To" videos and DVDs, some of which are used in colleges and in various state educational systems via television. He conducts workshops throughout the US and abroad. Couch has won over 70 national awards and his work has been included in three annual exhibitions of the National Academy of Design. For more information, visit tonycouch.com.

You can also print out a registration form from the Museum's website and mail it along with your payment.

Cancellation Policies

Half-Day Camps: All fees must be paid in full before a student is fully registered. Camps are filled on a first-come, first-served basis! Any cancellation or change made more than ten days before your child's first day of half-day camp carries a processing fee of \$50; if you cancel your registration before the ten-day deadline, you will receive a refund less the \$50 processing fee. No refunds can be given for cancellations made less than ten days prior to the start of the selected half-day camp.

The Huntsville Museum of Art reserves the right to cancel any half-day camp that does not meet minimum enrollment or for other unforeseen circumstances. We will do our best to notify families at least seven days prior to the start of a half-day camp session if a particular camp is cancelled. Any payments made toward a week of half-day camp that the Huntsville Museum of Art cancels will be eligible for a refund or can be applied to another half-day camp if space permits.

Classes: All fees must be paid in full before a student is fully registered. Classes are filled on a first-come, first-served basis! A \$50 fee will be charged for canceling registration; the balance will be refunded. A 50% fee will be charged for canceling parent/child classes; the balance will be refunded. However, there will be no refund for cancellations within one week of the first class. (Please Note: Master Artist Workshops' cancellation policy may vary depending on each workshop. Visit hsvmuseum.org/ academy/master-artist-workshops/ for more details.). The Huntsville Museum of Art reserves the right to cancel classes which do not meet minimum enrollment requirements. We will notify you at least three days in advance to start of the class if a particular class is cancelled. In the case of cancellation by the Huntsville Museum of Art, any payment towards a class will be eligible for a refund or can be applied to another class if space permits. The Huntsville Museum of Art assumes no liability for non-refundable airline tickets or other expenses that cannot be used due to any classes or workshops being cancelled or schedule changes.

Student check-in /check-out is required at the Museum Academy entrance by each parent/guardian. There is not a waiting area in the Academy studios.
